## Dakota County Technical College and Flint Hills Resources Announce Program for Entrepreneurs

Rosemount, MN – Prominent entrepreneurial leaders will share their expertise with students at Dakota County Technical College's new Business Entrepreneur Institute, under a program announced today by the college and Flint Hills Resources.
