Construction Underway on Koch – Habitat Home

WICHITA, Kan. – Construction by employees of Koch Industries companies starts today on the 60th Wichita Habitat for Humanity, Inc. home, located at 1948 Silver Street.

Koch Industries and its subsidiary Flint Hills Resources contributed \$55,000 to fund the home, which Koch company employees will build in 18 days. Walls will go up early today, and construction will be complete by July 30.

INVISTA, another Koch company, donated carpet and flooring for the house. Koch Cellulose will donate and help install the lawn using its new turf-establishment product, Blue Yellow™.
